Also, in 2021, the Lee Health Board of Directors approved the Community Health Needs Assessment implementation strategy. Through the assessment, we pinpointed opportunities based on real data of the health status, behaviors, and needs of people living in Lee County.

This Board-approved strategy will now be implemented over the next couple of years and includes system- and community-wide programs. The strategy includes access to healthcare services and health literacy, cardiovascular and respiratory conditions, mental health and substance use disorder, nutrition, physical activity, and weight (including diabetes).

Every year, Lee Health is committed to living our mission and delivering the care our community deserves and has come to expect from us for more than 105 years.



## Pediatric Mobile Vaccination Clinic

During the pandemic the Pediatric/Neonatal Transport team addressed the concerns of access to vaccinations by meeting people where they were, in the community. The pediatric mobile vaccination clinic provided free vaccines to not only eligible children but also their families and adults who visited the various locations out of convenience. From the start of the program in May through September the end of Lee Health's fiscal year, the pediatric mobile clinic:

- Visited 79 community locations
- Vaccinated 1,828 people through the pediatric mobile vaccination clinic



#### **Increased Access**

Lee Health is committed to providing regular updates with internal COVID numbers, education and best practices on how to keep yourself and loved ones safe throughout the pandemic. Drive-through testing sites and vaccination clinics were set up at various locations in Fort Myers and Cape Coral to serve the community. Monoclonal antibody infusions were also available to those in need.

- Performed 167,947 COVID tests and vaccinated 32,950 people at clinics and testing sites
- Administered 3,233 monoclonal antibody infusions

## Virtual Visits to the Doctor

## Lee Community Healthcare

Lee Community Healthcare (LCH) has 23 facilities throughout Lee and Charlotte County that provide primary medical care to medically uninsured and economically distressed communities. LCH patient care teams are committed to providing a medical home to those individuals that have historically used local emergency rooms to meet their primary care needs.

## **Injury Prevention**

The Lee Health Trauma Center Injury Prevention
Program provides community-based services,
education, and training prevention of violence, bullying,
substance abuse, motor vehicle crashes, sports injuries,
falls, and more. Mentor programs and support groups
are also offered for community members suffering from
traumatic injuries and events.

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## **Child Advocacy**

Trained advocates within Golisano Children's Hospital of Southwest Florida Child Advocacy Program provide education on child passenger safety, medicine safety, drowning prevention, bike/pedestrian safety, and many other risk areas. Child advocates also teach Safe Sitter and parenting classes.

#### **Kids' Minds Matter**

A portion of the Kids' Minds Matter program falls under the Child Advocacy program. Kids' Minds Matter addresses the



ongoing need for pediatric mental and behavioral healthcare services in Southwest Florida. Mental Health Navigators and Mental Health First Aid are two vital components of the Kids Minds Matter program. Mental health awareness presentations were provided to more than 1,000 community leaders and 310 at various community locations with community partners.
